Experience the rich past of Pinellas County with interactive activities and hands-on features. Explore 30 historical structures and features, part of this 21-acre living history museum.

Historic Structures

- **Beach Cottage** (circa 1939)
Typical tourist accommodations, now houses the Heritage Village Gift Shop
- **Boyer Cottage** (1878)
One-room fisherman's cottage
- **Caboose** (1967) Once part of the Seaboard-Coast Line Railroad
- **Demonstration Shed**
Houses workshops for traditional crafts
- **Fire Engine** Features a 1917 La France Fire Engine
- **Garden for the Blind**
Gazebo with plants and Braille identifying markers
Undergoing renovation
- **Greenwood House** (1888) Small family home originally located near "Clear Water Harbor," present-day Clearwater
Not open to the public
- **Harris School** Replica of a 1912 one-room schoolhouse
- **H.C. Smith Store** (1915)
Early neighborhood store complete with service garage and barbershop
- ★ **House of Seven Gables** (1907) Impressive 13-room Victorian home typical of upper middle-class early winter residents
- **Lowe Barn** (1911-1912)
Associated with the Lowe House; today displays agricultural tools and carriages
- **Boiling Shed** Used to process sugar cane syrup
- **Smokehouse** Used to cure meat and other foods
- **Sugar Cane Mill**
Used to grind sugar cane
- **Wheelchair accessible**
- ★ **Timed guided tours available at individual stations, check Visitor Information at Heritage Village for daily schedule**
- **Low House** (1888)
Beautiful two-story home built by early Pinellas pioneers
- **McMullen-Coachman Log Cabin** (circa 1852)
Oldest existing structure in Pinellas County
- **McMullen House** (1868)
Oldest continuously lived-in home in Pinellas County
- **Moore House** (1879)
Typical orange grove house
- **Heritage Garden**
A Florida vegetable garden
- **Outhouses** (early 1930s)
Depression-era outhouses
- **Water Tower** (1914)
Used to irrigate citrus groves
- **Windmill** (early 1970s)
Used to pump water on farms
- **Plant-Summer House** (circa 1896) Charming middle-class home
- **Safety Harbor Church** (1905) Simple rural church and community meeting place
- **Safford Pavilion** (circa 1892) Cemetery Shelter
- **Sponge Warehouse** (circa 1930) Restoration underway
Not open to the public
- **Sulphur Springs Depot** (1924) Typical of early railroad depots that once dotted Florida
- **Union Academy** (1915-1917) Classroom for African American students during the 1940s
- ★ **Walsingham House** (1915) Interpreted as a physician's home and office
- **Williams Park Bandstand**
Replica of circa 1894 St. Petersburg bandstand

Gardens & Displays

- **Aquatic Ecosystem Education Area**
Demonstrates how to transform a storm water runoff pond into a wildlife habitat
- **Azalea Garden**
Selection of azaleas for Florida climate
- **Bromeliad Garden**
More than 300 varieties of bromeliads which grow in the Central Florida landscape
- **Butterfly Garden** 
Plants that encourage butterflies and larvae to become permanent residents in a landscape
- **Cactus & Succulent Garden**
Selections that can be easily integrated into the landscape
- **Compost Demonstration**
Different methods of making compost
- **Cottage Garden**
A delightful mix of plants designed to mimic the old-world style of gardening
- **Florida-Friendly Garden**
Following Florida Yard & Neighborhoods program, plants featured are especially suited to survive in our diverse climate conditions
- **Herb Garden**
Culinary, medicinal, aromatic & economic herbs for Central Florida
- **Jazz Garden**
An enjoyable contemporary arrangement of plants
- **Native Garden**
A garden of Pinellas County native plants
- **Natural Area Trail**
A natural footpath through a Florida natural area provides examples of various habitats and views of Florida wildlife
- **Palm Area**
A variety of uncommon palms capable of growing and excelling in our climate
- **Palm Garden**
A variety of palms planted in a formal setting with a very tropical flavor
- **Patio Garden**
An intensely landscaped display of plants for use in a backyard setting, complete with gazebo, waterfall and pond
- **Rose Garden**
Displays of hybrid tea, climbing and other species of roses for the Florida climate
- **Topiary Garden**
Plants growing in whimsical forms and shapes
- **Tropical Fruit Garden**
Easy-to-grow fruits suitable for our subtropical climate
- **Tropical Walk & Courtyard**
A meandering path with pleasantly planted tropical plants to mentally transport you to a secluded tropical garden
- **Wedding Garden**
An impressive walled garden designed to host that special ceremony or event
